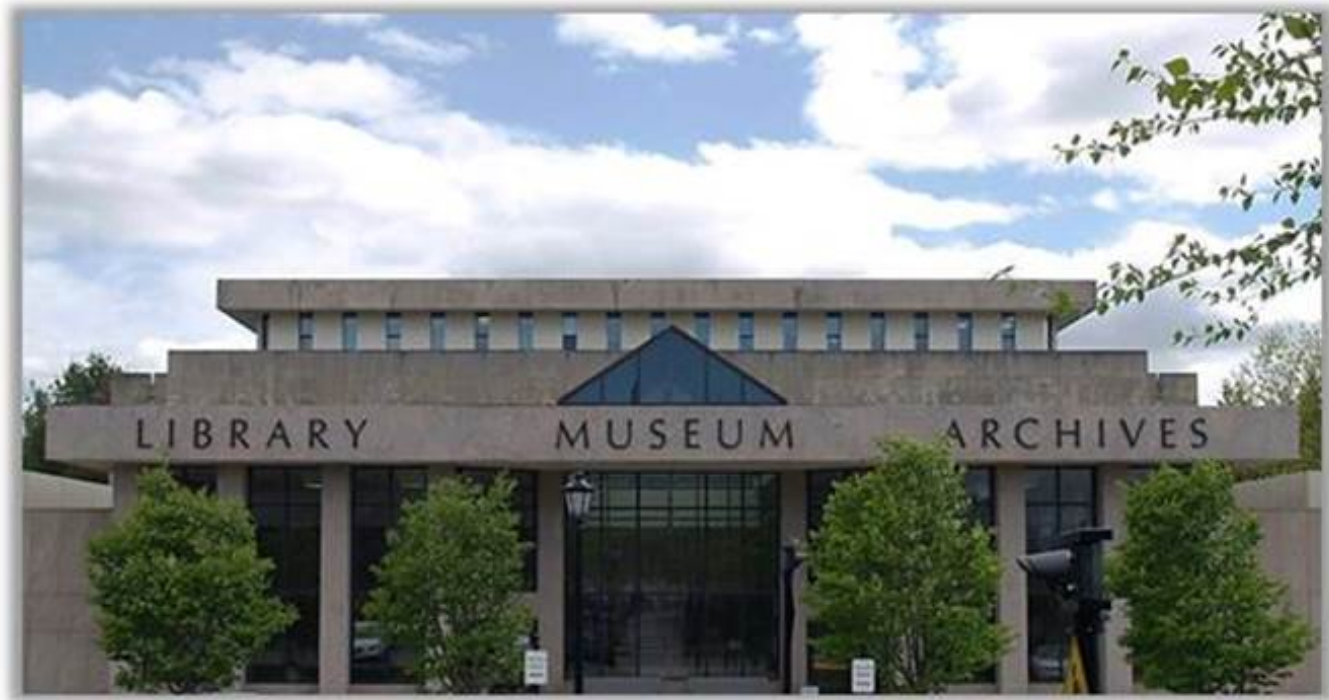

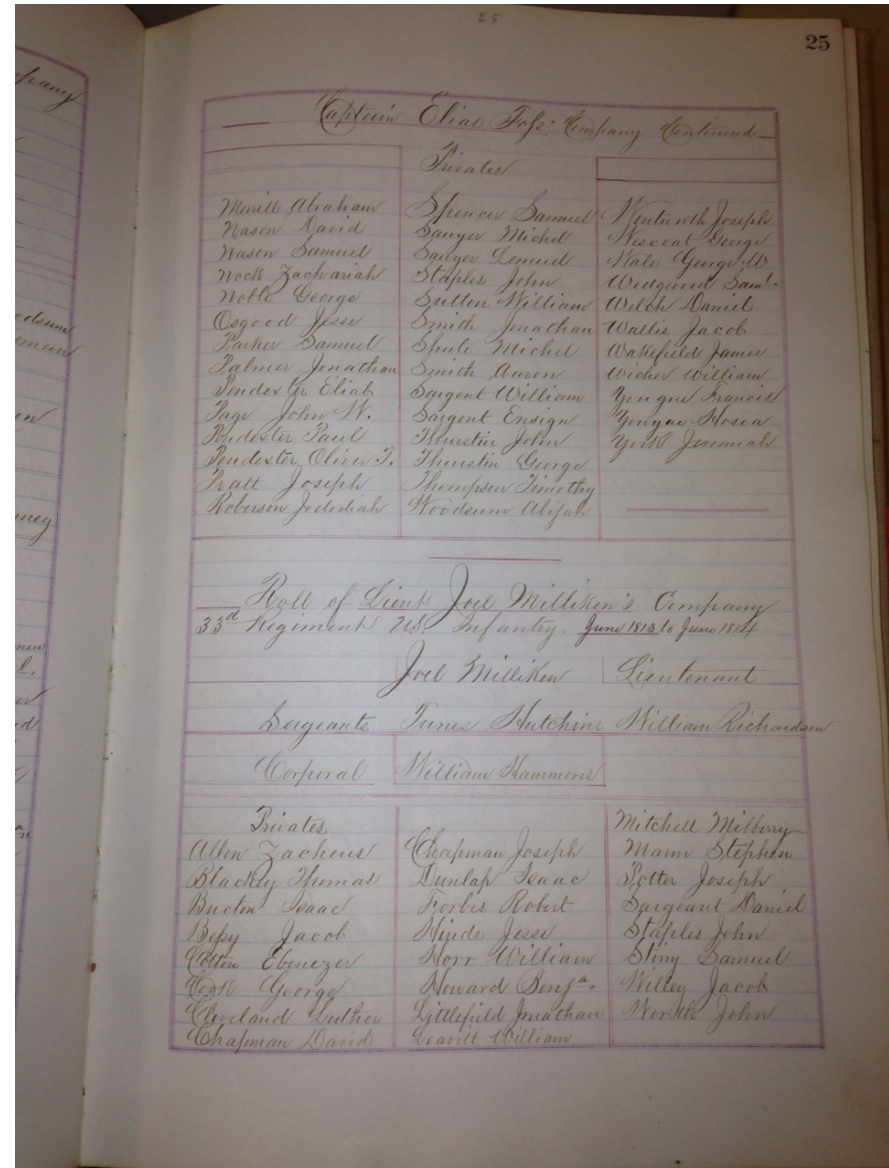

WE, whose names are hereunto affixed, do severally consent, by our signatures hereunto made, do agree to be enrolled into the Company to be raised by *Wm. Goodwin* a citizen of the State of Maine, acting under the authority of the Governor thereof, which Company is to form a component part of the "First Regiment of Maine Volunteers," which Regiment is, when called for, to be mustered into the service of the United States, and placed at the disposal of the President, under authority of an Act providing for the prosecution of the War declared in said Act to exist between the Republic of Mexico and the United States. And we do further hereby covenant and agree, to be holden by this enrolment, and well and faithfully to serve as members of said Company, according to the time for which we shall be mustered into the service of the United States.

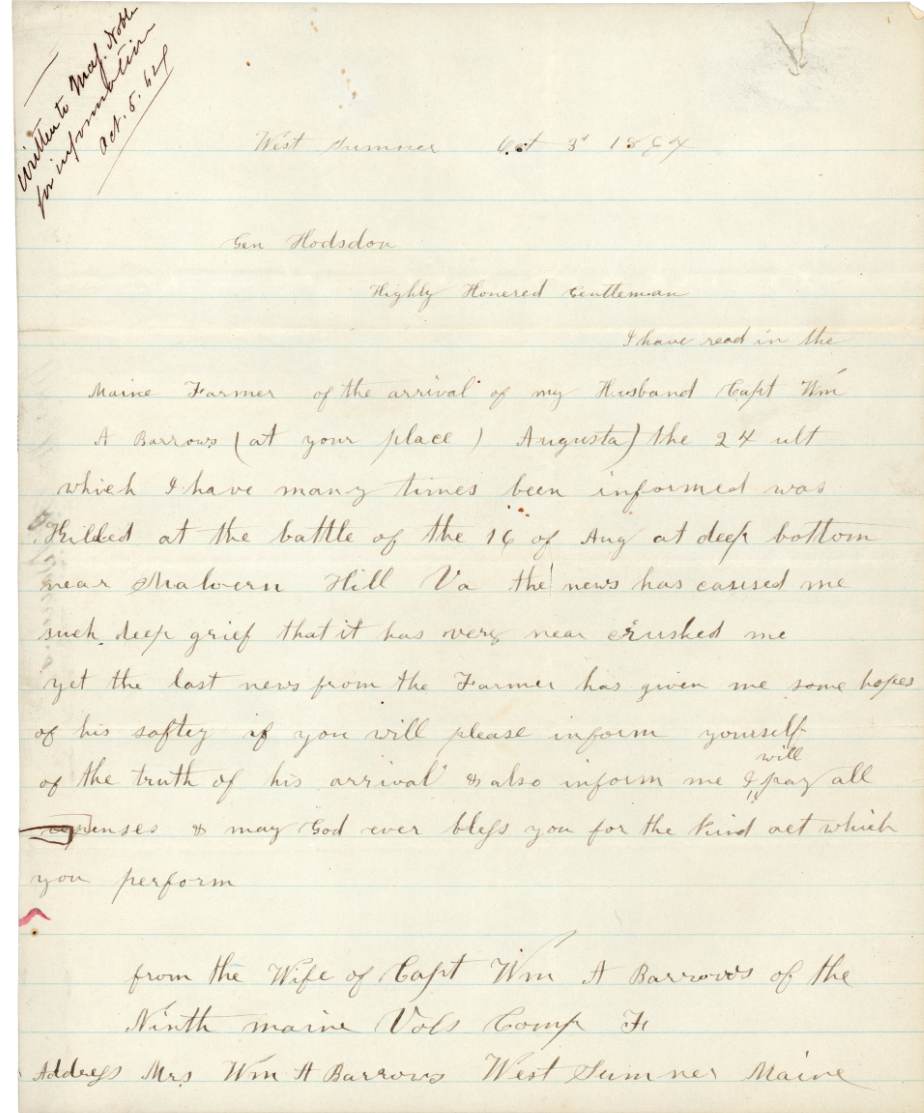
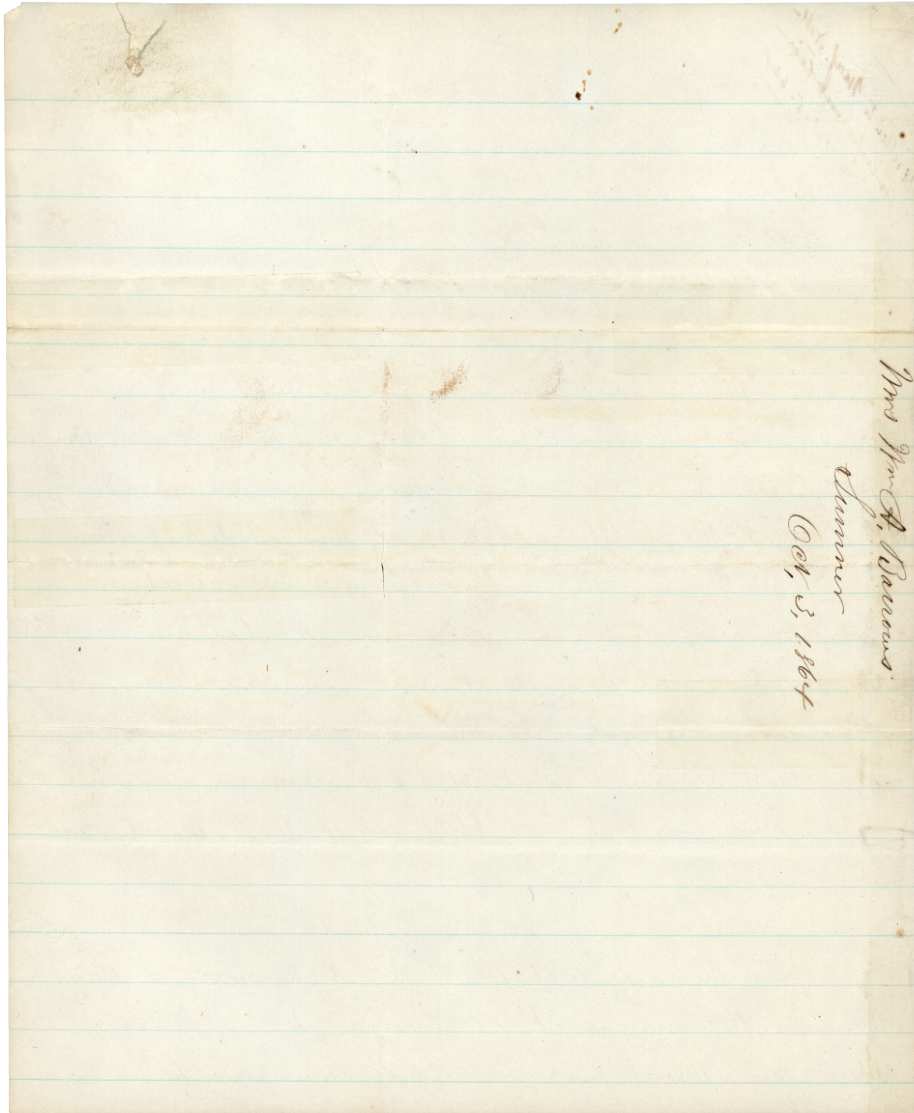

Sir,

I am aware that in addressing you I am stepping out of the common course, but the subject of my letter I trust will be a sufficient apology for my doing so.

On the first day of June 1841 there was an election of Officers in the A Company of Infantry in the town of Edmund, in this Regiment, at which time Ensign John Smith's was elected Lieut. and Mr. Isakood Scabod Preston was elected Ensign vice Sam Smith's promoted, and it appears by the Books in this Office, that the proceedings of said election were duly received & forwarded. I am also informed by the Adjutant ^{that they} have been forwarded a second time - but no commission for either of the officers elected at that time, has ever been ^{received} at this Office, I have written to the Commanding Officer of this Brig. on the subject and he writes me that he can give me no information relating to the matter, and I have thought it proper to address you on the subject, and ask for information.

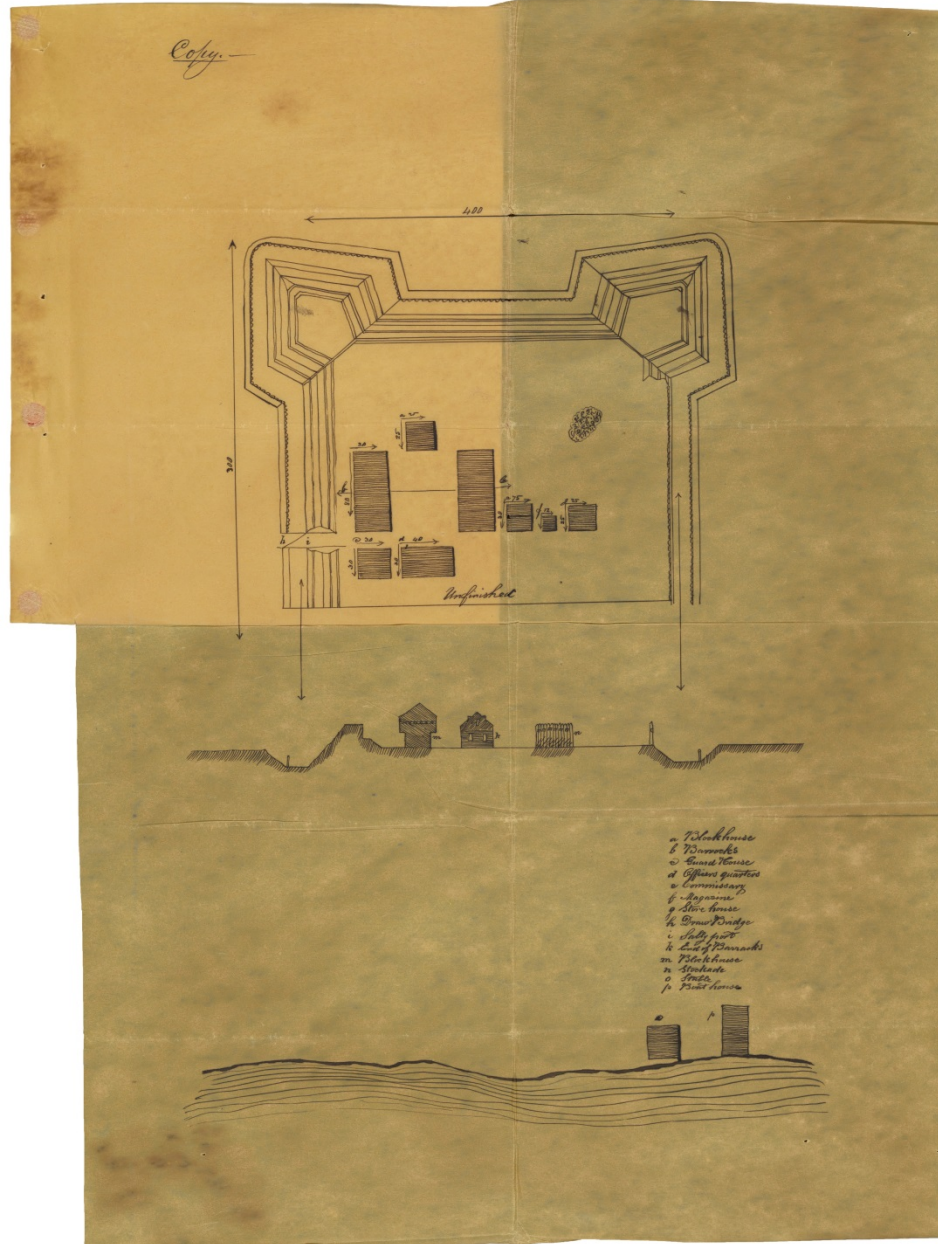

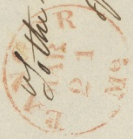

To the Gov & Council of the State of Maine

The undersigned Paul Somer, together with his brother Louis Somer having been appointed delegates agreeable to the petition herewith transmitted, would represent that there are treaties of peace & alliance between the several Northern tribes of Indians and the Penobscot tribe, one of the conditions of which is that, neither of the tribes shall make war or take any part in contests between the whites & other tribes of Indians without the consent of all the allied tribes

The object of the delegation is to enjoin the necessity upon them of refraining from taking any part in the present difficulties between the Province of New Brunswick and the State of Maine either in acting as spies or conducting troops through the woods, also in allaying the excitement which now exists amongst the inhabitants on the frontier with regard to excursions from the Indians, should you deem it advisable to grant the petition of Gov. Allen, the subscriber pledges himself to use his best endeavours to inculcate a spirit of peace, and to impress upon the minds of the Indians that their true policy is to refrain from all interference in the contests of the whites

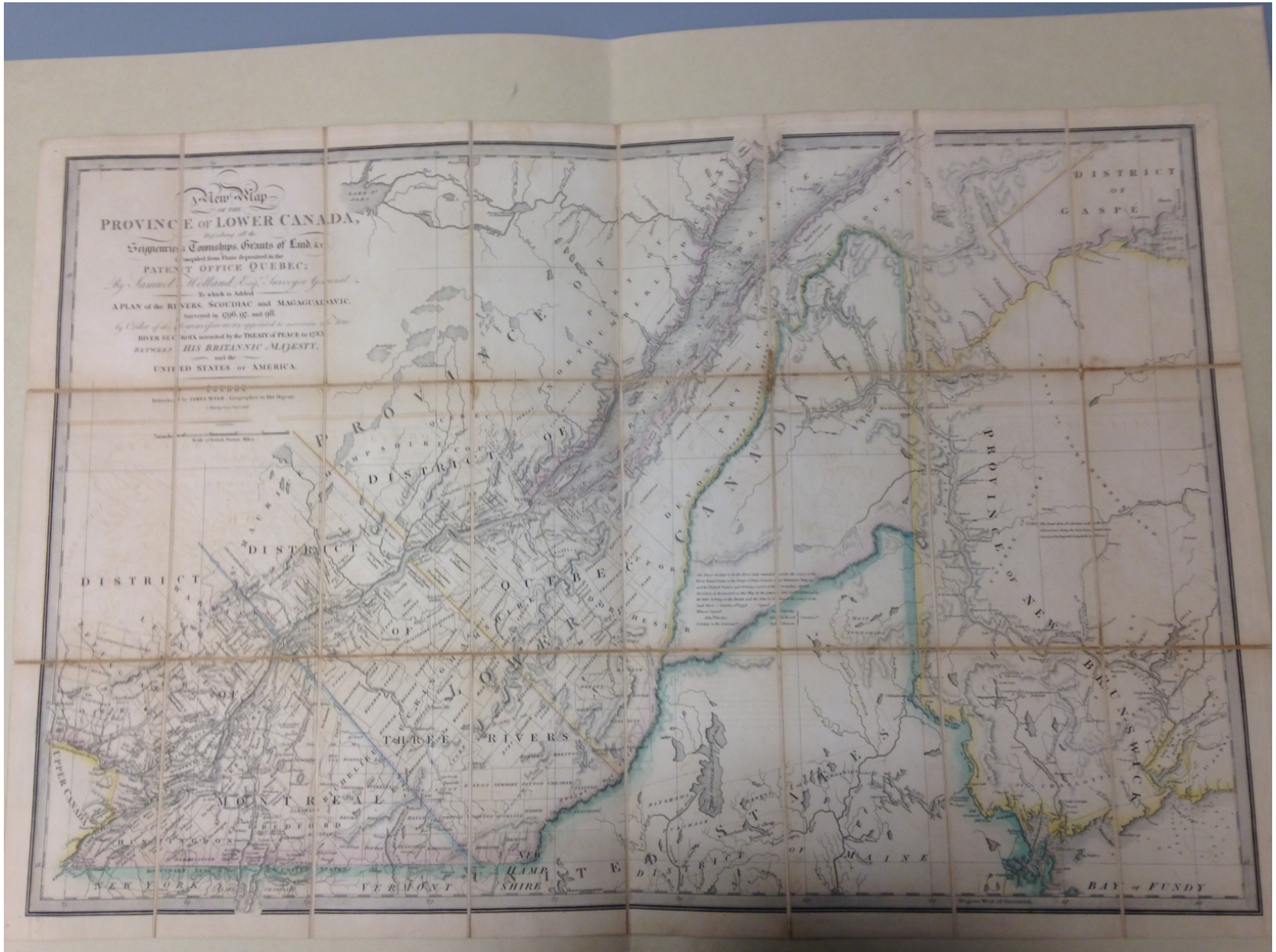

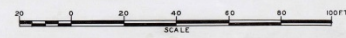
